Behavioural Insights for Policy (BiP) Network

BiP Portugal 2026 brings together researchers, policymakers, and practitioners working at the intersection of behavioural science and law. The workshop aims to advance the use of behavioural insights in legal analysis and public policy, while fostering collaboration between academia and public institutions.

As part of the Behavioural Insights for Policy (BiP) Network, the event contributes to a growing international effort to integrate behavioural evidence into governance systems and policymaking processes.

The BiP Network seeks to expand the reach of behavioural public policy by fostering its application across countries and policy areas. **We invite submissions for presentation at the 2026 workshop.**

The **workshop will take place over two days** and will include keynote lectures, academic presentations, and panel discussions. The event is designed to encourage interdisciplinary exchange and engagement with real-world legal and policy challenges.

Specialised Panels and Workshops: In addition to the main tracks, the programme will include focused sessions on behavioural legislative design, judicial bias, digital regulation, experimental methods, and capacity-building within public institutions.

Themes

The conference explores how behavioural insights are reshaping legal theory, doctrine, and policymaking.

We welcome abstracts that explore behavioural insights in public policy and related domains in the following areas:

- Foundations of Behavioural Law;
- Behavioural Legal Theory and Doctrinal Analysis;
- Behavioural Legal Design, Regulation and Compliance;
- Courts, Procedure and Decision-Making;
- Digital Environments and Behavioural Governance;
- Ethics, Legitimacy and Behavioural Governance;
- Experimental Methods and Institutionalisation.

Submission Guidelines

Abstracts should:

- Be no more than 200 words;
- Clearly state the research question or policy challenge;
- Outline the methodology or approach;
- Summarise key findings (if available);
- Highlight policy relevance and practical implications.
